Once again, the East Midlands has come out on top in our research. However there has only been a small increase from last time, so it's not all sunshine and roses.

Here are 3 key facts about salaries in the East Midlands:

The overall average <u>increased</u> by 0.8%

The shift average <u>increased</u> by 2.5%


Day shift average <u>decreased</u> by 0.4%

Next, we'll talk about the shifts available to engineers in this region. And how the shift pattern affects the salary they're likely to earn in a role.





SALARY VARIATION



Shift work means unsociable hours. Therefore, there are more of these roles out there.

SHIFT BREAKDOWN

9 shifts available in the East Mids

Most demanded = 4-on-4-off

Least demanded = Days and Rotating

13% of job adverts didn't specify the shift pattern of the role.

I don't understand why this is a thing. 'Competitive salary' shouldn't be allowed. You're just wasting your time and money. It's a **red flag**.

Days are becoming more popular.
Some are dropping production and moving to a Mon-Fri range of a shift pattern.

AVERAGE PAY FOR EACH SHIFT?

Highest paying on average = Panama (£49,417)

Doesn't surprise me. Get every other weekend off. Companies that do this shift pattern are usually bigger.

Lowest paying on average = Mon-Fri Days (£39,372) and Days (£39,802)

This is about right and where we'd expect but ideally above £40k.

Earn the least because there's less demand during standard hours, leading to fewer financial incentives like shift differentials or overtime pay.


DISTRIBUTION OF BIASES

This is about right. I'd expect multi-skilled to have the most adverts out there, as they can turn their hand either way.


Sometimes they advertise as **Multi but want an elec-biased**engineer. Most companies want



COMPARISON OF AREAS

Both Leicester and Derby have had a **small increase** in their average salaries.

However, **Nottingham has fallen short** in this round of research - check out how much it's decreased later on.

It's a shame to see both Nottingham and Derby at the bottom of the table again. We just weren't expecting Leicester to run away in terms of salaries again. But, here we are.

Hopefully these cities will improve as we head into 2024.

Derby made up **26.5**% of the job adverts we reviewed in the East Midlands region.


Out of the 3 areas we explored (Derby, Nottingham & Leicester) Derby sits in the middle when it comes to average salary.

Here are 3 key facts about salaries in Derby:

- The overall average <u>increased</u> by 2.1%
- The shift average <u>increased</u> by 0.3%
- Day shift average <u>increased</u> by 4.1%

These are just under where I think they should be. But not the end of the world. It's great to see all averages have increased!







I was expecting this to be the other way around in my opinion. With Elec paying the most.

Salaries are close, and there's not much in it. But I would expect Mech to be at the bottom.







Nottingham made up **34**% of the job adverts we reviewed in the East Midlands region.

Out of the 3 areas we reviewed, Nottingham sits at the bottom of the pile - with the lowest average salary for maintenance engineers.

Here are 3 key facts about salaries in the Nottingham:

The overall average <u>decreased</u> by 1.2%

The shift average <u>increased</u> by 1.5%

Day shift average <u>decreased</u> by 2.3%

Would have thought these would be higher as there are bigger companies here. Especially surprised by the Days salary. Maybe they're trying to get away with a lower salary.






These are too low, should be a bit higher. I'd want it to be around the mid 40's.

We've seen a clear majority of Multi-Skilled engineers. Likely because they can turn their hand either way when it comes to maintenance.







Leicester made up **39.5**% of the job adverts we reviewed in the East Midlands region.

Leicester had the highest average salary in the East Midlands region. This was unexpected - thought Derby would be top and Leicester bottom. The opposite of what was found.


Here are 3 key facts about salaries in the Leicester:

Day shift average <u>decreased</u> by 1.6%






